SUMMER VISITS:

Monday 24th **June 10:30am** Sherborne Museum, Abbey Gatehouse, Church Lane, Sherborne, Dorset DT9 3BP. We are visiting the Textile Collection (located upstairs with no lift) on a Monday when they are closed. We are restricted to a maximum of 20 - no reimbursement necessary, but any <u>donations are welcome</u>.

Afterwards Brian Gittos will show members around the **Conduit**, an unusual hexagonal shaped building just outside The Parade.

Wednesday 3rd July 11:00am The Painted House at The Old House, Lower Cockhill Farm, Castle Cary, Somerset BA7 7NZ. Numbers are strictly limited and it will cost £10 per member.

This will be followed by a visit to the **Cary Market House** at 2.30pm. Please note that there are no lifts at either location.

Sunday 4th August - visit to the **Cerne Abbey** archaeological dig site locating the actual location of the Abbey – details to follow.

Saturday 28th September 1.00pm- 2.30pm – visit to **St Michael's Church, Mere** and a **18th century cottage at Gillingham** - a wonderful church and a fascinating cottage. St Michael's Church Mere is famous for its 12th century external niche statue of St Michael, and work from the 13th, 14th, 15th and 17th centuries, including 15th century rood screen, misericords and tower. Those who wish can ascend the tower to see the ringing chamber and clock room with its chime barrel. Some tunes can be played, then on up to the roof for fine views. A female peregrine falcon currently in residence may still be on site. Followed by a visit to Andy Dutch's sons' 18th century cottage at Gillingham. There is no charge for the church visit but donations welcome.

This will be followed by a visit to the **Toll House in Gillingham at 3.00pm**. (Directions and parking etc to follow).
